What does the Bible say about prayer?

The Bible says a lot about prayer. The first mention of prayer is in Genesis $4:26 - \dots$ Then men began to call on the name of the Lord'.

Why should I pray?

Prayer develops our relationship with God. Prayer is communicating with God and helps us grow closer and more intimately connected with Him. Jesus instructs us to pray.

Matthew 7:7 – 'Ask, and it will be given to you; search and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened.'

Matthew 26:41 – 'Keep alert and pray. Otherwise temptation will overpower you'.

Luke 18:1 – 'Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up.'

Ephesians 6:18 – 'And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints.'

What words should I use?

Prayers need not be wordy or impressive.

Matthew 6:7 – 'When you pray, don't babble on and on as people of other religions do. They think their prayers are answered only by repeating their words again and again.'

Ecclesiastes 5:2 – 'Do not be quick with your mouth, do not be hasty in your heart to utter anything before God. God is in heaven and you are on earth, so let your words be few.'

What is the correct way to pray?

In the Bible people prayed on their knees (I Kings 8:45), bowing (Exodus 4:31), laid prostate (2 Chronicles 20:18; Matthew 26:39), and standing (I Kings 8:22).

What if I don't know how to pray?

The Holy Spirit will help you to pray.

Romans 8:26-27 – 'In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express.'

What are the requirements for successful prayer?

Humility

2 Chronicles 7:14 - 'If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.'

Total giving of self

Jeremiah 29:13 – 'You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.'

Faith

Mark II:24 – 'Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.'

Righteousness

James 5:16 – 'Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed.'

Obedience

I John 3:22 – 'And we will receive whatever we request because we obey him and do the things that please him.'

Does God hear and answer prayer?

Psalm 4:3 - '...the Lord hears when I call to him.'

Psalm 18:6 - 'In my distress I called upon the lord; to my God I cried for help.'

Should I pray alone or with others?

Together

Matthew 18:19 – 'Again, I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything you ask for, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.'

Alone

Matthew 6:6 – 'But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen.'
